# My Brother's Keeper Sacramento Youth Fellowship Program 2019-20



Mid-Year Program Update January 2020

The My Brother's Keeper (MBK) Sacramento Youth Fellowship program launched its third cohort of youth fellows in early fall 2019. Thanks to targeted recruitment from partners within the MBK Sacramento network, young men from across the city applied for the opportunity. Nearly thirty eligible applicants were interviewed, and eighteen selected as Youth Fellows for the 2019-20 Cohort, which kicked off with a full day retreat in early October. This year's Cohort represents a diverse group of bright, energetic young men, eager to connect with one another and create change.

Returning to lead facilitation of Fellowship meetings is a team of dynamic Mentor/Facilitators, comprised of leaders in education, youth engagement and justice reform. The Mentor/Facilitator team also engage with Fellows outside of meetings for 1:1 check-ins and additional supports as needed. In order to provide effective wrap-around support, the program activates partnership with the Black Child Legacy Campaign under the One Hood; One Brotherhood project. Engagement with educational leaders, families and other service providers also help to support the needs of MBK Fellows.

## Highlights from Fall 2019

### TARGETED RECRUITMENT

Through partnership with the larger MBK Sacramento network, recruitment for the MBK Youth Fellowship was stronger this year than ever before, with over 30 youth applying from various neighborhoods throughout the city. Eligible youth who were not selected were referred to partner mentoring agencies.

#### PEER MENTORSHIP


This year's Fellowship model incorporates the re-engagement of previous Youth Fellows as Peer Mentors. Five former Fellows were selected to serve as Peer Facilitators and Ambassadors for Cohort 3. MBK Peer Mentors inform planning, co-facilitate meetings, represent the Fellowship in various spaces, and support the day o day functions of the Fellowshoip

### **ENRICHMENT**

In response to feedback from Cohort 2 Fellows, opportunities for recreation are now integrated into each Fellowship meeting. An hour prior to each meeting is available for Fellows to hang out, engage in activities or games offered by the Boys and Girls Club, and build stronger relationships with mentors and with their MBK Youth Fellowship brothers.
